



**Health Aides Deserve Better: PNP Calls Out Government Over Long-Standing Neglect**

**Kingston, Jamaica. January 27, 2025:** The People's National Party (PNP) stands firmly with the Community Health Aides Association and the National Workers Union as they take a stand for fairness and respect in their two-day sickout. The party emphasises that the sickout is not just a protest but a reflection of the deep frustration and neglect these workers have endured for far too long.

"We can't claim to value healthcare while ignoring the needs of those who deliver it. The government must act now," Clarke added.

The PNP remains committed to advocating for the rights and welfare of all Jamaicans, particularly the unsung heroes in healthcare who continue to serve with dedication despite the challenges.
