The People's National Party's Diaspora Region continues to organize its structure. Membership in the PNP now extends to those who live overseas. We invite all interested Comrades outside of Jamaica to:

Diaspora Membership applications have been submitted to the Party's Secretariat and as of the end of October, there were 30 applicants for Direct Diaspora Membership. The Secretariat will contact applicants with missing information. Please continue to apply for direct membership to the Party online at <https://pnp.org.jm/the-diaspora/>. Remember that the Diaspora is now the seventh Region in the Party and is structured similar to the Regions on the island – 2025 will see elections for various positions in the Region and presents the opportunity for those Party supporters living outside Jamaica to become directly involved in the Party.

The Diaspora Region encompasses the entire world of Jamaicans who live overseas. The Region is subdivided into Six Zones that are further subdivided into Divisions. Each tier will have its own leadership structure and worldwide opportunities for participation at all levels and designated seats for the Party's existing affiliates. The Diaspora Region will operate as the other six Regions in Jamaica. The Diaspora will have the opportunity to vote in internal Party elections (1 Diaspora vote = 25%);

Members of the Diaspora are now serving on the Party's Commissions, Committees and Task Forces.





Calvert Barclay – Chair, PNP United Kingdom



The PNP-United Kingdom, an affiliate of the People's National Party welcomes a new president, Mr. Calvert Llewelyn Barclay. A graduate of Calabar High School, Kingston, Jamaica and the University of the West Indies, Mona, Calvert has a long history of involvement with the PNP. He was a member of the PNP-YO and served as YO Chair for West Rural St. Andrew 1977-1982; and he also served as assistant constituency secretary for several years.

A storied Social Worker in Jamaica where he worked at the Social Development Commission for more than 15 years, he migrated to the United Kingdom after being recruited in 2011 by the London Borough of Croydon to join their Social Care Services as a Child Protection Social Worker.

The married father of five sons, Calvert continued his PNP work by joining the PNP-UK of which he is now the Chair. Congratulations to Mr. Barclay from the PNP Diaspora Region and we look forward to working with you as we march on to progress.



Don Daly - Jamaican Diaspora Community Leader Laid to Rest in South Florida

The Jamaican community in South Florida came together on Saturday, April 5, 2025, in South Miami to say farewell to Don Daly, OD, one of its most faithful residents who died on March 21, 2025.

Don Daly was born in Flint River, St. Mary Jamaica in 1950 and migrated to New York in the United States in the 1970s. In 1980 Don and his wife Alreca moved to Miami and set about rallying the Jamaican community. Don saw the lack of a community gathering point and knowing the impact of radio on the Caribbean community, he bought time on a brokered radio station and launched the Saturday morning "Conscious Rhythm Show" in 1987.

He used his radio show as a community meeting place where on any given Saturday morning you could hear from Caribbean leaders about what was happening in the community, and from Caribbean leaders at home updating members of the Diaspora on goings on, spattered with the sweet sounds of reggae and soca music.

He used the show as a platform to launch Town Hall meetings before they were in vogue, and he introduced the community to their Consul Generals and took topical issues to the community for discussion.

He partnered with Jamaican companies in the Diaspora such as Air Jamaica, Jamaica National, Victoria Mutual, Grace Kennedy, etc., and the Caribbean Bar Association to host Town Hall meetings about immigration across the state of Florida and in Jamaica.

The invaluable information delivered to the community was critical in a time when social media and the internet were virtually non-existent in the late 1990s and early 2000s.

Don's kindness extended to the many non-profit organizations that emerged in South Florida where he



was Master of Ceremonies for the numerous events held in the community and introduced the organizations on his radio program. He kept his finger on the pulse of Jamaican politics and hosted regular live election coverage on WVCG 1080AM starting 1989 to 2016 with commentary from Dr. Garth Rose and others who shared their knowledge of Jamaican politics with the Diaspora.

His philanthropy expanded beyond radio and the South Florida community when in response to a request for assistance from one medical student, Don co-founded the Jamaican Medical Mission that for more than 20 years partnered with Nova Southeast-



ern University. Together with the assistance of sponsors, they took medical professionals to various rural places in Jamaica delivering much needed medical care to his fellow Jamaicans.



Don lived a life adhering to the principles of the People's National Party - helping his fellow man, was a ardent supporter of the PNP and continued his deep passion for Jamaica to the end. He was a devoted and loving family man and is survived by his wife Alreca, his children Danika and Yannick, his sisters Monia "Mika" Robinson and Clover Daly, and his granddaughter Harper. Rest In Power Don!
